November 30, 1995 - October 13, 2024

Aremon Lucas Alagheband, 28, formerly of Evanston, commodities trader, passed away at his apartment in Chicago's Gold Coast neighborhood.

Born and raised in Evanston, Aremon graduated from Pope John XXIII School and Evanston Township High School, where he played football as wide-receiver and talented sprinter, winning a medal in the 4x400-meter dash at the state level.

Aremon earned his Bachelor of Science in Public Affairs and Management from Indiana University, Bloomington and served as pledge master and social chair of Phi Delta Theta fraternity. He was a compliance intern at the Chicago Board of Options Exchange and, since 2018, worked as a commodities trader for Eagle Market Makers.

An extrovert with excellent taste, Aremon was well-traveled, having visited numerous European countries in the past year. Aremon enjoyed Michelin-starred restaurants, fine wine, truffles, and caviar.

Adored son of Taghi "Bijan" and Mary Jane (nee Schneider) Alagheband of Evanston, cherished brother of Kawveh John Alagheband, adoring partner of Madeline "Maddy" Fekkes Dynes.

“Aremon was my boyfriend of the last 9 years and gave me the most incredible 9 years, and was such a beautiful person inside and out. It is hard to still find the words to describe the loss of imagining a world and a future without him, so I will share some words from the speech I have at his services.

When I was thinking about what Aremon would want me to say today, the first thing that came to mind was how much he'd hate all this attention. But knowing him, he'd insist that I start by saying that he was incredibly handsome. And he absolutely was. His smile was gorgeous and hearing him laugh would fill me up with joy. I was lucky to witness it so often.

He'd also want me to mention how strong and big he was. And he was. Aremon's included insane amounts of protein—five eggs every morning, at least two pounds of chicken a day. He made health and exercise his daily priorities and taught me to take care of myself, too.

But while he was all of these things—he was also so much more. There were sides to him that not everyone got to see.

First, he was brilliant. Aremon had an incredible depth of knowledge. From Greek history to watches to tennis, he was a walking encyclopedia of the most interesting facts. He would get every question right when watching an episode of Cash Cab with ease.

Second, he was an exceptional cook, which was something he learned from his father's upbringing. His creativity in pairing food and wine was unmatched. Even in his last week, he was texting me brilliant ideas for cheeses and truffles to pair with a new port wine we'd just bought. It breaks my heart that we won't get to share that moment together now.

Third, Aremon was a fiercely loyal protector. He made me feel safe and always watched out for those he loved. Chicago never felt unsafe with him by my side—he was the kind of person who would always have your back.

Fourth, his drive and ambition were unmatched. Aremon never gave up on his dreams. His determination to provide comfort for his family

for generations was so inspiring. On his last day, he studied for five hours for the GMAT and had a conversation about his career goals with one of my family friends, who described him as “one of the most optimistic, focused, and determined prospective students I’ve ever spoken to.”

Finally, Aremon was my rock. He gave me strength and comfort through every challenge, assuring me that we would get through anything together. He was my constant reminder that, no matter what, we would always be okay.

As we try to move forward in a world without Aremon’s beautiful smile, we can honor him by carrying his light and spirit with us. We can do that by:

- Taking care of and protecting the people we love, just as Aremon always did. His family and friends are pieces of him that I will cherish every day.*
- Staying ambitious and never giving up on our dreams, because he wouldn’t want us to quit.*
- And remembering that we are stronger now, because Aremon will be watching over us and guiding us every step of the way.*

Aremon, we love you, and we will carry you with us forever. You will live on in every moment we share that reminds us of you—whether it’s watching Harry Potter, drinking a top-shelf bottle of wine, sitting in your spot on the sofa, cooking a perfect steak, watching the US Open, or sitting outside smoking a cigar. You are with us in all of these memories and so many more.

I speak for many when I say the memories we created with Aremon will stay with us forever. He will be missed dearly.

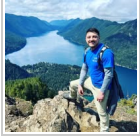
