Nancy Natalia Feid, 74, of Rogers Park, born in Lima, Peru; passed away peacefully April 12, 2026.

Nancy worked for years as a hairstylist and then as a Certified Nursing Assistant at Garden View nursing home in Rogers Park. A lifelong learner, she attended ongoing humanities classes at Truman College.

She was known for impulsive expressions of generosity, like feeding her grandchildren Flamin' Hot snacks and slipping the dogs special treats under the table, despite the protests of family. Nancy believed that children and pets deserved to fully enjoy themselves.

Several years ago, while visiting Peru with her daughter, she hired a ten-year old child to serve as her "tour guide" The young boy revealed that he was living in a dumpster and that he loved to play soccer. Nancy removed the Adidas from her own feet and gave them to the boy. Nancy's generosity was especially broad at the end of her life, and she was deeply grateful to her caretaker.

Nancy was a devout Catholic and prayed for her living and deceased relatives.

Devoted mother of Natalie Ruth Lev (nee Feid), dear mother-in-law of Grigori Lev, and adoring grandmother (“Gramma Nancy”) of Mikhail and Miriam Lev.

Survived by sisters Ana Maria (the late Agosto), Irma (Aurelio), and Linda.

Preceded in death by siblings Celeste, Carlos (Roseanne), the late Natalia, one stillborn sister and their parents Jose Antonio Jimenez and Yolanda Alicia Caballero.

Nancy trabajó durante años como estilista y, posteriormente, como Asistente

de Enfermería Certificada en la residencia de ancianos Garden View, en Rogers Park. Con un espíritu de aprendizaje constante, asistía a clases continuas de humanidades en el Truman College.

Era conocida por sus impulsivos gestos de generosidad, como darles a sus nietos bocadillos "Flamin' Hots" y deslizar golosinas especiales a los perros por debajo de la mesa, a pesar de las protestas de la familia. Nancy creía que tanto los niños como las mascotas merecían disfrutar plenamente de la vida.

Hace varios años, durante una visita a Perú con su hija, contrató a un niño de diez años para que le sirviera de "guía turístico". El pequeño le reveló que vivía en un contenedor de basura y que le encantaba jugar al fútbol. Nancy se quitó las zapatillas Adidas que llevaba puestas y se las regaló al niño. La generosidad de Nancy se manifestó de manera especialmente amplia al final de su vida, y sentía una profunda gratitud hacia su cuidador.

Nancy era una católica devota y rezaba tanto por sus familiares vivos como por los difuntos.

Madre abnegada de Natalie Ruth Lev (de soltera Feid), querida suegra de Grigori Lev y abuela adorada ("Gramma Nancy") de Mikhail y Miriam Lev.

Le sobreviven sus hermanas Ana María (cuyo esposo, Agosto, ya falleció), Irma (con su esposo Aurelio) y Linda.

Le precedieron en la muerte sus hermanos Celeste, Carlos (con su esposa Roseanne) y Natalia (ya fallecida), así como una hermana nacida muerta; también sus padres, José Antonio Jiménez y Yolanda Alicia Caballero.
