Nancy M. Price, 86, died on November 25, 2025 at St. Francis Hospital in Evanston, IL. During a lengthy illness, she had been a resident of Birchwood Plaza Nursing Home in Chicago, where she remained strong and cheerful.

She was born in Chicago, the daughter of Herbert T. Price, Jr. and the former Elinor Howell. She was a descendant of John Pryce, who arrived in the Virginia Colony from Wales in 1620. She spent her formative years in Chicago, a suburb of New York City and in Houston, TX. She earned a Bachelor's Degree in art from the University of Texas at Austin, where she was active in student Christian organizations. She was baptized in the Episcopal church and became a born again Christian.

Nancy was a commercial fashion artist at Chas A. Stevens department store on Chicago's State Street and later entered sales positions. She lived for many years directly opposite the Lake Michigan beach in Chicago's Rogers Park and loved spending summer weeks on the beach at the Indiana Dunes and at Union Pier, Michigan and enjoyed a six month visit to Hawaii.

Nancy was a peaceful soul who was loved by all who had the good fortune to know her.

She is survived by sisters Stephanie Price of Chicago, Priscilla (Polly) Price of

Normal, IL, brother Tryner Price (Leslie Price) of Wilmette, IL and by nephews Drew Price of Evanston, IL, Kent Price of Tampa, FL and niece Haley Price of Wilmette, IL.

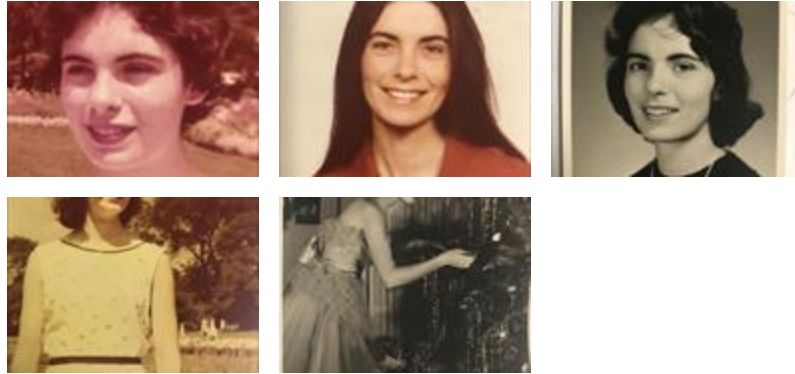
