Peter Bruce Rekdahl, 80, of Chicago's Lakeview neighborhood, formerly of Ravenswood, passed away peacefully after a long battle with Parkinson's Disease.

Born in St. Louis Park, Minnesota, Peter graduated St. Louis Park Senior High School and attended the University of Chicago.

Peter worked as the Information Technology Manager at Chicago-Read Mental Health Center. He was largely a private person, but we do know that he enjoyed summertime visits to Minnesota's North Shore with his sister, read philosophy and loved opera and classical music, particularly Bach. He traveled to Turkey, Monaco, and Italy and was a former treasurer of Chicago Prime Timers and the longtime Chairman of the Yesteryear Condo Association. Peter collected art and antiques and was also a skilled organ player, which is no minor achievement.
